## U.C. BERKELEY ARTSBRIDGE AMERICA SCHOLAR

Artsbridge was a program connecting teaching artists (U.C. Berkeley students) with local school classes in underserved communities where no art programs were available. During this semester of art classes taught at a local public elementary school, I created artistic and educational objectives through development of a unique curriculum and taught weekly art lessons to children. The art lessons included various media and methods, from charcoal portraiture, abstract pastel drawings and plaster hand casts, to using fruit and decay to create 2D works. Each of these lessons were infused with agendas to foster greater awareness and to explore social justice topics.
